Practical Workshop on Teaching Methodology for Nature and Biodiversity

A Practical Workshop on Teaching Methodology for Nature and Biodiversity was organized by the Jaffna Entomological Society (JES) at the request of the Principal, Mr. R. Senthilmaran, under their proposed *Teachers' Professional Development Programme*. The workshop aimed to enhance teachers' competence in delivering environmental and biodiversity concepts through effective, hands-on, and field-based teaching approaches.

- To strengthen teachers' understanding of key concepts related to Nature and Biodiversity.
- To introduce innovative, learner-centered, and practical teaching methodologies.
- To encourage the use of field-oriented and experiential learning techniques in science education.
- To promote environmental awareness and appreciation of biodiversity among students through effective classroom practices.

A total of thirteen Science teachers of Jaffna Hindu College, who teach Grades 6–10 participated in the workshop. The participants actively engaged in discussions, demonstrations, and group activities in the field - designed to link theory with real-world experiences.

The workshop was conducted on 5th November 2025, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., at the Department of Zoology.

The session was inaugurated by the Senior Professor S. Noble Surendran, President Elect/JES, who emphasized the importance of field-oriented teaching methods in fostering curiosity, critical thinking, and a deeper connection with nature among students.

The programme was designed by Professor (Mrs.) R. Gnaneswaran, as

- Interactive sessions on innovative teaching tools and classroom strategies.
- Practical demonstrations on biodiversity observation and data collection techniques.
- organizing model field session to get outdoor learning experiences.
